Bunyip CFA Good Friday Appeal

This Good Friday, Bunyip CFA was out in force raising funds for the Royal Children's Hospital Good Friday Appeal.

The Appeal has been raising funds for the Children's Hospital since 1931, supporting groundbreaking research, and world-class equipment and staff who create miracles every day improving the lives of thousands of children and their families.

Partnering with our community and supporting businesses, Bunyip CFA had members out at IGA, and Gumbuya World, shaking tins to collect what we could.

Many Community members and their families also volunteered their time on Good Friday to assist, helping with door-knocking around the Bunyip Township.

Overall, Bunyip raised \$10,624 for the Appeal, an improvement of over \$1,000 from last year's total of \$9,154, and well over our goal of \$10,000.

We are so excited that we could beat our best, and achieve a 5 figure donation for such a worthwhile cause. We couldn't achieve this without the support of the local community. Having so many people dig deep and donate what they can, along with volunteering their time to help with the effort really shows how community-minded our little town is.

A big thank you as well goes out in particular to the Bunyip Expresso Café, for keeping our members well fed and caffeinated, as well to Gumbuya World for their ongoing support, and making a massive effort to ensure that we collected as much as possible.

Planned Burning Underway

Fire Authorities get an extremely limited window each year to conduct planned burning.

Planned burning operations are an extremely effective way to significantly reduce the fuel load in a local area.

These are conducted strategically, and under specific conditions, with access to a large amount of skilled Firefighters, along with professional Firefighting Appliances. They are given special permission to conduct burning operations during the Fire Danger Period.

Smoke may be visible in the area, from planned burns across the local region. You can keep up to date with current planned burns, and set a watch zone, by visiting https://plannedburns.ffm.vic.gov.au/



Fire Danger Period Still in Force.


While the weather is cooling off slightly, and we hopefully looking at the back end of the summer weather, the area is still extremely dry, and the Fire Danger Period is still in effect.

All burning off remains illegal without a written Fire Danger Period Permit.

We have seen a rise in the number of burns being conducted without a permit, and wish to remind the public to be aware of current conditions.

Our local area is drier than during January and February this year, and is a reason to why Fire Restrictions are still in place.

Bunyip Soccer Cricket field officially open

Cardinia Shire Council officially opened the Bunyip Soccer Cricket field, located at Bunyip Recreation Reserve, at a special opening event.

Works at the redeveloped field included:

- New drainage and irrigation to reduce maintenance and water costs
- Upgraded sports field surface for safer play
- New perimeter fencing
- Synthetic covered cricket wicket located between the two pitches
- New 100 LUX LED lighting, and;
- Interface works to link the sports field and the existing pavilion.
 The sports field upgrades also included upgrades to 2 soccer fields, one for juniors and one for seniors.

The exciting redevelopment was jointly funded by Council and the Victorian Government. Cardinia Shire Council contributed just over \$1 million to the project, while the Victorian Government also provided \$500,000 as part of the Community Support Fund.

Cardinia Shire Mayor Councillor Jack Kowarzik officially opened the new community asset with Bunyip Ward Councillor Graeme Moore, and sporting representatives from the Bunyip soccer and cricket clubs.

"The community has been looking forward to this redevelopment for some time, and we're delighted to be able to declare the Bunyip Soccer Cricket field officially open," Mayor Kowarzik said.

"This project is a great improvement to the reserve and the upgrades will better meet the needs of the sporting and wider community in Bunyip."

Member for Eastern Victoria, Harriet Shing MP said she was pleased that the upgrades have been officially celebrated.

"I am delighted that the upgrades have been officially celebrated with an opening ceremony. Better sport and recreation facilities make it easier for us all to get involved in our local sporting communities, helping to lead healthier, more active lifestyles."

Did you know that Bunyip had a Caledonian Society?

A Caledonian society is a family oriented group that embraces all elements of Scottish Heritage.

On the 3rd August 1907 a meeting was held to form a society in Bunyip, the Scots of the district were convinced that a society would be sure of solid support. A committee was formed consisting of Messrs. Young, McGregor, Ross, McIntosh, and Hill. Mr James McIntosh became the secretary. The first sports day was held on 22nd January 1908, followed by an evening concert, and these events including banquets continued into the 1930's except for a short break during the war years.

TALKIN' Zen Moments

Fishing was and is a source of aquatic food supply, the recreational side came later as a means of relaxation and as a sporting pursuit. Unlike 'Golf' which is in my case the exact opposite, with a depth of frustration and disappointment unmeasurable, no matter how much practice time I put into it, thank God I'm a fisherman, not a golfer!

The contrast with fishing is, I can have a day on the river or in a boat without catching a fish, and I can still say I've had a nice day out. The only time I can honestly say I've felt frustrated is when you get plenty of bites but just can't seem to hook up, or they go off the bite and move to who knows where? Sitting on a riverbank quietly on your own listening to what's going on around you and your eyes fixed on your rod tip or your float gently moving around can put you into a trance like state, with only a bite indication jolting you back into reality. With 'Covid Lockdowns' now only a bad memory the value of your own timeout is now seemingly so important after a busy day at work or in the home. A short break on the river or pier is a lot like a small holiday as a means of forgetting it all and having a Zen moment to yourself, processing the day and allocating unfinished tasks into the to -do basket. After all that's what tomorrow was made for!

There is no need to kit yourself out completely, Rod and Reel, a few lures in a small tackle box, don't worry about bait, a net is always a good idea to take. Small breaks like this through the week brings the weekends closer together. The benefits to your mental health have been proven in many ways in support groups or one-on-one therapy or just time shared with a mate or family member can be both mind and body calming. No need to go far either, spots can be found close-by within half to one hour away in local lakes, reservoirs, rivers and dams within your community, contact your local council for information of these locations and any fishing regulations applicable.

There is a regular gathering of women dealing with breast cancer that are supported greatly with equipment, supplies of flies and advice from men's groups enjoying tuition in fly casting and learning to fly fish together, this has proven to be highly beneficial and motivational while going through their recovery and treatments. In 2023 there were over 10,000 plants put in at the site, which covers more than 5 acres. The property belongs to Melbourne Water, who is the major funder of the revegetation project. Over the past 18 months, weed contractors have been busy spraying the blackberries, flax leaf broom, scotch thistle, onion weed, bridal creeper, wild turnip and pittosporums.

The native plants we put in at last year's community plantings are doing well, some are thriving, others not so much. We are learning what plants are best suited at the site, which before settlement was predominantly swamp paperbark and swamp gum. The birdlife is already increasing and as the plants grow the variety of bird species and numbers will grow too. The Latham's Snipe has recently been sighted there. This is a migratory bird which breeds in Russia and Japan and spends its non breeding period in Australia on the south east coast and Tasmania. This bird is listed as vulnerable, so we were excited to find them visiting. The southern brown bandicoot is another important species we are endeavouring to establish at Lovers Lane. This year we are installing bandicoot shelters to help protect them from predators. We will also be undertaking a fox control program at the site to reduce the devastating impact they have on the bandicoots and other native animals.

We hope many people will come along on the 5th May to see the progress and to help with the next stage of planting.




Need for Feed was established by the Lions Club back in 2006/7 in response to what was at that time the driest period on record and what became known as the Millennium Drought. The bushfires that raged as a consequence of the drought affected many farmers and rural communities. At that time, reportedly 3 farmers per week around Australia were taking their own lives and many others walking off their land, unable to cope with circumstances beyond their control.

Lions Club member Graham Cockerell, who had lost his own father years before to farm related suicide, didn't want see other farmers and their families go through the same heartbreak. The point is, said Graham, "My father wasn't a bad farmer, in fact quite the opposite; He found himself in circumstances beyond his control where he could see no other way out".

From quite humble beginnings, as an organisation this Lions Club Project "Need for Feed has grown and grown to the point where we could now be considered the leading volunteer organisation providing hope and help for farmers and rural communities across most of the country. The total value of aid delivered over the life of the project to date would be in excess of \$30 million.

These bags will be for sale on the stall of Frank and Robyn Hill at each Bunyip Community Market until sold out. The Hills have been supporters of this project for years and have raised in excess of \$1000.00 so far. If you enquire at the BBQ at the Market, you will be directed where to go. The

Negotiations for this exciting project are still on-going but in a major development we have decided to install a much larger battery in order to assist with stabilising the local grid.

The proposal is now for a 5MW/10MWh.

Working with AusNet to get grid connection approval for this new configuration is a substantial process and we will be working through this with our partners at Komo Energy.
