#### **BUNYIP-GARFIELD PROBUS CLUB**

Our speaker this month was Jim Connelly who had grown up in Garfield where he attended the Garfield State School then went on to the Warragul High School before going to University that lead him to a 30 year career of teaching. Jim shared some of his memories of growing up where he played football and cricket with the local club and he remembers the first film he saw the "The Wizard of Oz" at the Old Garfield Picture Theatre. He recalled many names of past local people that some of us also remembered. It wasn't until he retired that he started to write and publish 15 books. The first three were for children and then including "Growing up in Garfield " and " Tales of Old Gippsland ". He published works spans much of Gippsland and its rich history from way back to recent times . After we thanked him we were able to look at his books and purchase any if we wanted.

Our group went to the Holden Museum at Trafalgar for a look back on the history of all things Holden have produced over many years long before Australians drove Holden cars. We learnt that the iconic brand had its name on saddles, buggies, golf clubs, trams and engines. These were some of the facts we learnt on the day. The company started its humble beginnings as a saddlery in Adelaide were the Holden name became synonymous in engineering innovation and industrial pride along with Australian ingenuity.

The Museum is housed in an old dairy factory and is a non- for profit organisation which is run by enthusiastic Holden volunteers and was opened in 2014. There are all different models of Holden Cars as well as a Motorsport Tribute to Peter Brock. Other displays were all kinds of Utes, Melbourne tram, Military Equipment, Holden built patrol boat along with many more other displays to look and admire the way everything was presented. After spending the morning there we went to the Trafalgar Hotel for Lunch.

I'll spend my wintery days tying up knots and Flies, tidying up my gear and finding the favourite stuff I put away safely for the 'Best Days'.

(Really I just forget where the hell I put anything).

# Nice warm toes? Remember where the smoke goes Tips for everyone who has a wood burning heater keeping their toes warm this winter.

Victoria's environmental watchdog has some handy tips for everyone who has a wood burning heater keeping their toes warm this winter.

EPA Victoria says the condition of the heater, the flue and the fuel you're using all contribute to seeing more, or less, smoke from your chimney.

EPA's Chief Environmental Scientist Jen Martin says you'll get less smoke and more heat for your money, if you do it right.

"Have your chimney professionally cleaned every year, only burn dry, clean wood, and extinguish your fire before going to bed or leaving the house," Dr Martin said.

"Don't leave it smouldering, it's inefficient, generates more smoke and creates a fire hazard," she said.

Wood heater owners have an obligation, under the Environment Protection Act's General Environment Duty, to minimise the smoke from their wood heater. EPA urges anyone burning wood to consider their neighbours' health and seek alternative heat sources, especially on calm days with not much wind.

The people most sensitive to smoke from wood heaters are those with heart or lung conditions such as asthma, pregnant women, young children, those aged 65 years and over, people with diabetes and smokers.

"If you suffer from heart or lung disease and you notice symptoms of smoke exposure, take your regular medications, rest and seek medical advice if the symptoms persist," Dr Martin said.

Another important tip is to avoid burning the wrong things, including coal, coke, driftwood, household rubbish, painted wood, chemically treated timber or the green-coloured pine logs used at parks and playgrounds.

The EPA website has more information for anyone who wants to be a good neighbour and create more heat and <u>less smoke from their wood heater</u> (epa.vic.gov.au/manage-smoke-woodheaters).



#### COMMUNITY FEEDBACK INVITED ON KEY STRATEGIC DOCUMENTS

Council is inviting feedback on the draft Council Plan 2025–29 and updated Liveability Plan 2017–29 as part of the final phase of community consultation in the development of these key documents.

Cardinia Shire Mayor Cr Jack Kowarzik said the Council Plan was Council's overarching strategic document that would drive Council's direction for the next four years and support Council to deliver on its commitment to the community.

"The Council Plan is our key document that will help guide our direction and decision making for this Council term, outlining how we will deliver on the long-term Community Vision, work towards our key strategic objectives, respond to challenges and leverage opportunities," Mayor Kowarzik said. "As one of Victoria's fastest growing municipalities, it's important that we plan for our future to ensure our Shire remains a great place to live, work and play. This draft Council Plan outlines our approach to respond to the Shire's rapid growth and challenges over the coming years, and will support us to deliver on our commitment to the community."

The draft Council Plan is underpinned by five strategic objectives:

- Thriving communities
- Vibrant places
- Adaptive environments
- Prosperous economies
- Responsible leaders

The strategic objectives have been informed by priorities identified by the Community Panel during the deliberative engagement process earlier this year. The panel reviewed and updated the Community Vision 2040 and identified a number of key focus areas that have helped to inform the strategic objectives. A series of strategies and initiatives have been developed to achieve each of these strategic objectives, with strategic indicators to measure how they will be achieved by Council. The initiatives include tangible actions that will help Council meet community needs over the coming four years and beyond.

Below are examples of initiatives under each of the strategic objectives:

- Develop and implement a Volunteers' Strategy to support volunteers and encourage volunteer participation.
- Plan and deliver accessible and inclusive recreation and community facilities.
- Develop a Towards Zero Emissions Plan to ensure progress towards zero emissions and carbon neutrality, and implement the plan.
- Conduct a comprehensive gap analysis of community and human services, education and skills, with recommendations to support advocacy and funding to attract service providers to operate in Cardinia Shire.
- Provide opportunities for meaningful, informed and representative community engagement to guide Council's decision-making.
  - Mayor Kowarzik said feedback had also helped to inform development of other key strategic documents, including the updated Liveability Plan 2017–29.

"This is our 2nd, 4-year review of the Liveability Plan 2017–29, which has been developed to provide a clear framework for public health planning in the Shire," Mayor Kowarzik said. "The plan recognises Council's role in coordinating local public health planning by bringing together a range of organisations, groups and our local community to work together to protect, improve and promote the health and wellbeing of our community.

"The changing needs of our community and insights gained from the recent community engagement activities have helped to inform our updated Liveability Plan. We want to ensure the plan's objectives reflect our community's current challenges and priorities, to effectively guide the way in which we partner with organisations and our community to enhance the liveability of our Shire, and the health and wellbeing of our community."

Hopefully this gazebo will also serve as a monument to remember returned services personnel. To this end discussions are underway with the local RSL and Rotary groups for support and funding.


We are also hoping that local community groups and individuals may like to consider a donation to support this project.

#### **Lithium-ion Battery Safety Awareness**

Many preventable house fires occur in Cardinia Shire every year and lithium-ion battery failure as a cause, is becoming more common.

Lithium-ion batteries are a type of rechargeable battery which are available in different sizes. Most laptops, mobile phones, e-bikes, e-scooters, power banks and power tools contain them.

**Risks and injuries from product** - Lithium-ion batteries can be highly flammable, can be very difficult to extinguish and may reignite.

The ACCC saw a 92% increase in reported lithium-ion battery incidents including swelling, overheating and fires in 2022 compared to 2020.

If a lithium-ion battery is not correctly manufactured, handled, stored, charged or disposed of, it can catch fire, explode or vent toxic gas.

**Things to look for when buying** - There isn't a mandatory safety standard for lithium-ion batteries or products containing them.

Ensure you buy products that contain lithium-ion batteries from a reputable supplier and <u>always follow the manufacturer's instructions for use.</u>

#### Handling and storing a lithium-ion battery product

#### What to do

Store lithium-ion batteries and products in cool, dry places and out of direct sunlight.

Allow the lithium-ion battery to cool after use and before recharging.

Buy replacement batteries from the original supplier or a reputable supplier where possible.

Keep lithium-ion batteries separate from each other when removed from products.

Consider installing a smoke alarm in your garage if batteries are to be stored.

#### What not to do

Never use lithium-ion batteries, products or chargers that show signs of failure such as:

- denting, crushing or other damage
- overheating
- swelling
- leaking
- venting gas.

Don't leave lithium-ion batteries or products in hot places such as in parked vehicles.

Don't modify a lithium-ion battery or use it in the incorrect product.

Never use batteries designed for one product in another product.

#### Charging a lithium-ion battery

#### What to do

Monitor device charging times and disconnect products from chargers when fully charged. Consider setting timers as a reminder to unplug devices.

Charge lithium-ion batteries or products on non-flammable surfaces such as concrete, ceramic or steel.

#### What not to do

Never charge lithium-ion batteries or products on flammable materials such as beds, sofas or carpet. Never use damaged chargers or charging cables.

#### Disposing of a lithium-ion battery product

#### What to do

Check safe disposal options at Recycle Mate or B-Cycle to safely get rid of lithium-ion batteries or products.

#### What not to do

Don't throw away lithium-ion batteries or products in household rubbish, recycling bins or hard waste collections. This can cause fires in bins, garbage trucks and waste facilities






