



In the event of an emergency, you may not be able to open locked gates due to injury, illness or loss of power. Always make sure gates are working properly and can be opened by emergency services.

Ensure electric gates have a manual over-ride feature so that emergency services can access your property.

Padlocks and bolt locks on gates make access difficult for emergency service personnel and may delay them getting to you. Think about what other options are available or could be used to allow access for emergency services.

Can we access the fire hydrant?

Unless there is a sign saying that you can, you are not allowed to park, stop or leave your vehicle within 1 metre of a fire hydrant, fire hydrant indicator or fire plug indicator.

Fire hydrant locations are marked by blue reflective indicators on marker posts or existing poles, and blue cat's eye reflectors on the road so they can be identified at night.

CFA uses hydrants for a continuous flow of water during firefighting. It is vital for firefighters to have immediate access to the water supply.



Bunyip Cemetery Trust

The Bunyip Cemetery Trust is of the belief that the needs of our community and the those of families outside Bunyip who require our services will not be able to be met by our cemetery in its current form.

Having access to the adjacent five acre site classified as public land will be a necessity for our expansion over future years.

We have undertaken an environmental audit, supported by Cardinia Shire, and it is apparent that there are approximately 39 significant trees and some rare orchids on the site but no endangered fauna was detected.

In its current state the public land is also a bushfire risk.

The trust wants to protect and further enhance the environment by developing a park like cemetery on the vacant land whilst still caring for the current cemetery site.

We are calling on the Shire to assist us with planning support, which could include issues related to carbon credits and other matters that will need to be addressed.

It should also be noted that there is a possibility we could receive assistance to realise our Vision in the form of grants from the Department of Health.

As a group of mature, local volunteers we need our local Shire to give us advice, and a helping hand!

'Get red-y' for new rubbish bin lids



From February 2024, all kerbside rubbish bins in Cardinia Shire will transition to red lids over a four (4) week period. The red lids will replace any existing dark green lids on these bins.

This change is taking place because the Victorian Government is standardising household waste and recycling services across the state, including lid colours.

Under the new and improved system, lime green lids will be for food and garden waste, yellow lids for recycling, and red lids for general rubbish.

Some community members already have a red-lidded rubbish bin. For those who don't, all they will need to do is leave their kerbside rubbish bin out until

6pm on their usual general rubbish bin collection days from Monday 5 February to Friday 1 March 2024, or until their bin lid is swapped for a red lid.

Once their lid has been swapped, community members can place their kerbside rubbish bin out on bin collection days as normal.

Old lids will be recycled and turned into new kerbside bins.

Cardinia Shire Mayor Councillor Tammy Radford said the standardisation of bin lids across the state will make it easier for people to put the correct items in the correct bin – no matter where they are in Victoria.

"Whether you're visiting friends and family, travelling, or moving to a new area, it will be much easier to know what goes in each bin as it will be the same throughout Victoria.

"This will help improve household recycling rates, decrease contamination and reduce waste sent to landfill."

Mayor Radford encouraged the community to use this as an opportunity to make sure they know which items belong in each bin.

"This change is a great opportunity to learn about how we can all do our bit for the environment by disposing of household items correctly. You can head to council's website to find out what goes in each bin.

"Let's work together to improve our recycling efforts and reduce waste sent to landfill, helping our environment and economy along the way," Mayor Radford said.

This project is supported by funding from the Victorian Government.

Hooks chemically sharpened, ball bearing swivels, lures of all types and more lifelike than ever before, flashing, buzzing, shimmy and shaking in a perfect balanced dancing action. Soft plastic lures in more configurations of colours, textures and sizes with flavours than you can only possibly imagine. Many comprised outfits or combos have been purposely designed to target certain species only, just to suit you, so precise and fine-tuned is the equipment now. Line is now thinner, stronger, superior in every way to last longer and keep you connected with the fish, but the smart ones still manage to get off.

When you next shop for your tackle load up, especially coming up to Xmas, spare a thought for the research and development that has gone into your sport and the gear you'll use and be grateful rather than daunted with the choices we have to select from. Make sure when you shop that if you're not sure of the product you want ask plenty of questions, most shop assistants are very keen anglers themselves and are right up to date with all the new stuff and only willing to help. These things make our fishing experience a very personal and customized fit-out to suit just what we require. Your tackle shop is rather like a jewellery shop for the angler, the beauty of what sparkles and shines on display still gives me a thrill, and helps to make my wallet a little lighter. Take advantage of the technology and trust me, there's no going back once you've had the experience of new verses the old

What major changes in banking have you seen:



Regional Rail Revival

Bunyip and Longwarry station precinct works - November 2023 Gippsland Line Upgrade

We are installing new signaling infrastructure along the rail line as part of the Gippsland Line Upgrade to enable more frequent and reliable services for passengers.

We will be undertaking 24-hour works between Friday 24 November to Sunday 10 December while trains aren't running on the line.

These works include:

- ongoing track duplication works at Hope St, Bunyip and Longwarry Station
- formation and pavement work for the new pedestrian crossing connection to the southwest of the Bunyip Station car park
- swale drain upgrades and installation along the rail corridor in Garfield, Bunyip and Longwarry
- installation of signaling equipment rooms between Tynong and Longwarry, along with line wide signaling upgrades
- delivery of materials, plant, and equipment to the Tynong, Wally Road Bunyip and Cook Road Longwarry site laydown areas.

Works will also continue along the rail line to prepare for construction of maintenance access roads, which may require removal of some non-native vegetation near the tracks

What to be aware of

There will be no vehicle or pedestrian access over the level crossing at Hope Street, Bunyip between Friday 24 November and Sunday 10 December. During this time, a vehicle detour will be in place via Longwarry or McIntyre level crossing in Garfield.

Pedestrian access will be available via the existing east rail crossing at Bunyip Station. Access with prams/strollers and mobility aids may be difficult during this time. If you have accessibility or mobility needs, please call the project team on 1800 105 105 in advance for assistance with your journey.

How we are minimising impacts

Dust - We use a range of measures to minimise dust from construction activities, including placing dust monitors in and around the construction site, staging works to minimise exposed areas and the use of water carts to wet down work areas.

Noise and vibration - To minimise potential noise and vibration impacts we monitor noise and vibration levels to make sure they are within the Environment Protection Authority noise control guidelines and limit out of hours work.

Lighting - Where possible, light towers will be positioned away from residential properties and solar light towers will be utilised to limit noise.

Victorian Government launches Container Deposit Scheme

Community members will be rewarded with a 10-cent refund for every eligible can, carton or bottle they return to designated collection points, with the Victorian Government's Container Deposit Scheme.

Collection points can be found across Victoria, including the following Cardinia Shire locations:

- Emerald SES (277-287 Belgrave-Gembrook Rd, Emerald)
- Cockatoo IGA (15 Fairbridge Ln, Cockatoo)
- Beaconsfield Upper Foodworks (7&8/4 St Georges Rd, Beaconsfield Upper)
- BP in Officer (65 Princess Freeway, Officer and 94 Princess Freeway, Officer)
- BP Pakenham (92-96 Princess Highway, Pakenham)
- Return It Depot (100 Bald Hill Rd, Pakenham)
- Nar Nar Goon Hotel (2 Nar Nar Goon Rd, Nar Nar Goon)
- Bunyip IGA (2/6 Main St, Bunyip)
- With more to come!

Containers that can be returned include drink bottles, glass beer bottles, soft drinks and alcohol sold in cans, and small fruit juice cartons.

All these items will be recycled into new products, reducing landfill and litter across the Shire.

Returned containers need to be empty and in reasonably good condition (not crushed and labels intact). Keeping lids on also ensures every part of your container is recycled.

10-cent refund options include cash, vouchers, donations, or electronic payment for items.

The scheme also provides fundraising opportunities for charities, local businesses, community organisations, schools, and sporting groups.

This will encourage more community participation and education around recycling while ensuring households, local clubs and groups can share in the cash benefits of recycling their used cans, bottles, and cartons.

Cardinia Shire Mayor, Councillor Tammy Radford is excited for the environmental and economic benefits of the scheme and encourages the community to get involved.

"This scheme is a great way for children to earn some pocket money and for local sporting clubs to fundraise."

"By returning containers, the community contributes to creating a cleaner and greener Cardinia Shire and earns money doing so."

Outgoing Mayor Cr Tammy Radford congratulated the shire's newly elected Mayor and extended her thanks to the community. "I am extremely proud to have served as your Mayor in 2022-23, and I'm looking forward to working alongside my fellow councillors in the final term of this council to better connect our community and improve the life of all citizens," Cr Radford said. This is the final year of the current (2020-2024) council term, with a new council to be elected in November 2024 for the subsequent 4 years. 
