Cardinia Shire's Citizen of the Year 2024

Dr. Mary Cole

Dr. Mary Cole, a much loved and respected local resident from Vervale was awarded and acknowledged as Cardinia Shire's Senior Citizen of the Year at the Shire's annual Australia Day function held at the Cardinia Cultural Centre last Thursday evening.

Dr. Cole has been prominent in laboratory research, new developments, lecturing and mentoring students and holding Field Days for farmers on maintaining and improving soil qualities.

Dr. Cole's aim is to introduce farmers to biological farming with the view of improving soil health and productivity giving them a sustainable future while raising standards of environmental awareness, encouraging debate in alliterative and more sustainable farming methods and generating innovative ideas for the long-term health of our planet for future generations.

Each year Dr. Cole has one of the local schools send one of their students of carry out work experience in the lab for a week. As Agpath is unique in Cardinia Shire, we provide an independent laboratory experience for science students and it is a way that I am able to give back to the next generation of young scientists.

After receiving her award, Dr. Cole told the audience that when she was four years old, her father took her into a field and asked her to hug a tree......." that's where this passion of mine began," she said.

It's been a very wet start to 2024!

We've seen over 150mm fall so far, and there is still lots of green around.

CFA are asking all landowners to be vigilant when baling their hay, possibly for the second or third time this season.

If excess moisture remains inside the haystack when it is bailed, it is at risk of spontaneously combusting - meaning that it will catch fire on its own. This places a significant risk to life and property, especially so in the more rural parts of Bunyip.

Watch for signs of heating hay

Regularly monitor all haystacks for signs that the hay is heating up. You can do this by using a temperature probe or crowbar.

Other signs of heating include:

- steam rising from haystacks
- condensation or corrosion under hayshed roofing
- mould growth in or on bales
- unusual odours like a burning, musty, or caramel smell. Sometimes you may detect a smell like pipe tobacco.
- slumping in sections of the haystack.

Temperature Guide

Insert a temperature probe or crowbar into the middle of the haystack for two hours, then take a reading.

Less than 50C. Can handle crowbar without discomfort

Check the temperature daily

50C to 60C. Can only handle crowbar for a short time

Check temperature twice a day

60C to 70C. Can only touch crowbar briefly

Move bales apart to improve air flow. Check temperature every 2 to 4 hours

Over 70C. Crowbar is too hot to hold

Potential for fire. Call Triple Zero (000) immediately. Pulling the haystack apart may introduce the oxygen needed to ignite the hay. Avoid walking on top of haystack.

Are your campfires safe?

With some warmer weather expected in the later part of Summer, we see a significant amount of travel out to the regions, including our own Bunyip State Park.

If you are going to use a campfire whilst out in the bush, please ensure you are taking steps to keep fire out of the bushland.

- Ensure the wind is less than 10 km/h. This means that leaves are moving around in the wind.
- The campfire must be lit in:
- A properly built fireplace of stone, metal or concrete.
- o Or a trench at least 30cm deep.
- o The campfire must be no larger than 1 meter by 1 meter.
- o The area 3 meters around and above the campfire must be clear of anything that can burn.
- o Never leave the fire alone. A person who can put out the fire must always stay by the fire.

The campfire must be put out completely using water before you leave.

**Note that if you are in a State Forest or National Park, there might be other rules you need to know about.





The Fire Danger Period is in force across Cardinia Shire.

While it has been wet across the area, it is still illegal to "burn-off" during this time. Authorities are expecting the weather to warm up again, and the risk of dangerous fire conditions very quickly returns with a short stretch of hot, dry weather

Heavy fines and possible imprisonment are actively enforced by Police for contravening the Fire Danger Period.

Please ensure that you are not burning open air fires during the Fire Danger Period, unless you hold the appropriate written Fire Danger Period Permit to burn.

Emergency Kits are handy, easy-to-prepare grab-and-go packs to ensure you have key items to help you more easily evacuate. It should be prepared before it is needed so that in stressful times when you need to grab it, nothing is forgotten.

Council's FREE green waste drop-off events are back!

Residents are encouraged to drop off their green waste for free at the upcoming Green-waste drop off events in Pakenham and Lysterfield.

Due to increased popularity, this year there are 6 days for each drop-off event, giving residents even more days to drop-off their green waste

The service helps Cardinia Shire residents to clean up and reduce the fire fuel load on their properties throughout the year.

Council's green waste drop-off events are accepting residential amounts of green waste including garden prunings, tree branches and trunks (up to 30 centimetres wide and 1 metre long), weeds, grass clippings, leaves, and flowers.

TALKIN' ... FISHIN' A CUT ABOVE THE REST.

Looking over past articles I can't believe that I haven't covered this subject before, but now is as good as ever. All through the many years of fishing, I've owned and discarded many different fishing knives for the purposes of cutting, cleaning, filleting and chopping etc. I've discovered over that they mainly come down to 3 necessary types... they are.

- 1. Bone cutter and chop, it should be a robust strong blade of 100-150mm long with a thicker back edge to the blade so you can put added pressure down with the other hand. A sharp edge but with less bevel on the cutting edge than a fillet knife, more like an axe or meat clever, this will prevent chipping of the blade when cutting through bone, like when removing heads, tails, spikes and fins.
- 2. Fillet knife, should be comfortable with a non-slip grip and a 150-250mm long blade at 15-25mm wide at the handle, with a fine pointed tip, thinness and flexibility of the blade is the key here, it will facilitate ease of travel through flesh, and should flex to follow the vertebrae guiding it along as it flexes and contours the body smoothly. You may choose a longer blade but that would only be necessary if the variety of your targeted fish has a wider than usual body, like a Tuna for instance. When filleting Whiting, Salmon or Flathead it's most suitable to have the flexible blade using it to also separate the scale and skin from the flesh in one smooth sweep or in a sideways sawing action, then trim out the small remaining bones from the fillet using the fine point.
- 3. General Purpose, or folding pocket knife, should be ever available for the quick nick of your line, cutting hooks out of your clothes or fleshy parts of your body. A better usage is gutting fish that have an outer skin like a Trout or Cod, slipping the blade along the belly from the anal cavity to gill cage opening it up for cleaning out the entrails and gut linings. A long blade is a hindrance in this case, a short fine tip blade of 50-90mm long is plenty.
- **4. Accessories** that should be included for safety reasons are knife sheaths to protect the blade and yourself, a filleting chain mesh glove and a good grip floating handled knife if you're using it in a boat. A fish scaler is better bought separately, rather than being incorporated on the back of your knife as some are.

A sharp blade is safer to use than an almost sharp edge that you have to force through a catch's flesh and possibly your own! Keep a sharp edge, do this by regularly touching up the blade with a quality sharpener or stone.

More Room For Signalling Upgrades in Gippsland Bunyip Track Work Headlines Blitz

New track for the second platform at Bunyip Station was built through the Hope Street level crossing during our latest construction blitz.

The first of six new signalling equipment rooms (SERs) being installed as part of the Gippsland Line Upgrade has been lifted into position between Nar Nar Goon and Tynong stations.

The SER, weighing in at almost 16 tonnes and with a footprint of 44 square metres, was installed as part of work to prepare the Gippsland Line for a new signalling system.

This work progressed alongside V/Line maintenance during a construction blitz in late November and early December while coaches replaced trains.

More than 260 people worked more than 30,000 hours between Pakenham and Traralgon, including installing new track at the Hope Street level crossing in Bunyip.

Crew members worked around the clock, allowing Hope Street to reopen to vehicles and pedestrians a week early.

The new signalling equipment room between Nar Nar Goon and Tynong stations will be a crucial link between the signalling systems used in Gippsland and the metropolitan network.

The new signalling system for the Gippsland Line, in conjunction with track works and station upgrades already delivered as part of the Gippsland Line Upgrade, will enable more services and also future-proof the line.
