



The Fire Danger Period is now in effect for the Cardinia Shire Local Government Area. This commenced on Monday, 18th December at 1am. Do you know what you can and cannot do during the Fire Danger Period?



Can I burn off?

NO unless *:

you have a written **Fire Danger Period permit** issued by CFA, FRV or a Municipal Fire Prevention Officer, depending on the location of the activity

you comply with the conditions of that permit

A person is in attendance at all times while the fire is alight and has the capacity and means to **completely extinguish** the fire

The fire is **completely extinguished** before the person leaves.

Can I have a BBQ?

NO unless*:

The wind is less than 10 km/h. This means that leaves are moving around in the wind.

The area 3 meters around and above the fire must be clear of anything that can burn.

The area within a distance of 3 meters from the outer perimeters of the fire and the uppermost point of the fire is clear of flammable material

Never leave the fire or BBQ alone. A person who can put out the fire must always stay by the fire.

The BBQ must be turned off or the fire completely put out when finished.

*Note that in accordance with the CFA Act, a commercially-produced barbecue or portable gas stove is considered a properly-constructed fireplace.

Can I light a campfire?

NO unless*:

The wind is less than 10 km/h. This means that leaves are moving around in the wind.

The campfire must be lit in:

A properly built fireplace of stone, metal or concrete.

Or a trench at least 30cm deep.

The campfire must be no larger than 1 meter by 1 meter.

The area 3 meters around and above the campfire must be clear of anything that can burn.

Never leave the fire alone. A person who can put out the fire must always stay by the fire.

The campfire must be put out completely using water before you leave.

*Note that if you are in a State Forest or National Park, there might be other rules you need to know about.

To find out more information about the different rules and restrictions that apply during the Fire Danger Period, visit <u>cfa.vic.gov.au/can</u> ***Rules change during days of declared Total Fire Ban**

Victoria Police will investigate any reported violation of the Fire Danger Period. Large fines and imprisonment can result in breaches of the Fire Danger Period and Total Fire Ban restrictions.

Do you have a bushfire plan?

Bushfire Plans are critical so that you and your family know what to do in the event of fire in your local area or planning ahead for dangerous conditions.

Do you have a **plan**? Will you **leave early**? What is your trigger to **leave**? What are you going to do with **children** or **animals**? If the Fire Danger Rating for the following day is **Extreme** or **Catastrophic**, what will you do? What are you going to do with **valuable items** and **precious memories**? Does your plan cater for **evacuation** for multiple days?

Leaving early is always the safest option.

With the Fire Danger Period now in force, it's vital that you familiarise yourself with the new system and how you should act in bushfire-prone areas.

TALKIN'FISHIN' THE CUTTING EDGE

Fishing line is made tough to withstand fish biting through it and abrasive action from rocks and other objects that can weaken it. That's great news but the drawback is it's also hard to cut for trimming off knots and joining lines to each other or knotting to terminal tackle etc. Using your teeth is a common practice, but the bite down will destroy the nerve in your tooth along with the enamel coating, leaving you with uncomfortable dental work, root canal filling is unpleasant and expensive.

Best practice is to use a reliable sharp cutting tool. These can be as cheap as nail clippers, side cutters or high carbon nippers with hardened sharp edges, stainless steel will resist rust. Choose something of a convenient size to fit in your pocket or vest maybe hang it around your neck on a lanyard. Make sure that it's not going to stab you or make a hole in your clothes if you take a fall, look for types that come with a holder or pouch. The ability to sharpen this would be handy or buy a cheap enough replacement of the same each season.

Along the same lines, knife sharpeners are many and varied in their design. The process should be an amount of steel removed from the blade edge each time you draw it through, a finer amount coming off each time you change the surface grit material you draw the edge across, all to achieve a sharper final edge. Finish off with a sharpening stone lubricated with water or a light oil, this will give an excellent cutting edge, using a dry sharpening steel rod will still produce a good result. A sharp knife has less chance of cutting you, as it requires less force and effort to slice through flesh, therefore reducing your possibility of injury or cutting yourself. A mesh safety filleting glove is a good investment in safety. There are 1000's of knives to choose from but each has its purpose, make sure you talk with a knowledgeable salesperson to help you with your selection for the purpose you intend. A conversation with a Chef or abattoir boner will have good information on this subject as it's their trade.


