

Cannibal Creek Catchment Landcare Group

Cannibal Creek Catchment Landcare Group held two plantings in May and another 4 are planned for June. The May plantings were at the Lovers Lane Site in Garfield but this time at the Lone Pine Road end.

Our annual Community Planting Day in May was down in number of participants but 2100 plants were put in the ground and all were guarded.

Pakenham Secondary College plus 10 members of the group met on the Lone Pine Road site to put in another 500 plants.

In June there will be another School planting with Pakenham Secondary College and Neerim Secondary College are joining with them for the day.

Two companies will also join us for 2 plantings Cummins Engineering from Pakenham and Chobani from Cranbourne at the Lone Pine Site.

As the drought progressed causing the ground to be rock hard we were able to use another patch of land on the Lovers Lane site. This would have been unsuitable also if we had not had support from Holcim Quarry providing a truck to water the site weeks prior to the planting and regularly after the plantings to keep the plants going. We are very grateful to Tim the Manager and Paul the driver for the excellent job they have been doing.

Later in June we have a planting on private land in Tynong North which will add to the BioLinks in the Cardinia Shire. Another plus for the environment, thank you to everyone for their efforts.





As Victorians head outdoors to enjoy the King's Birthday long weekend, fire and land authorities are reminding campers and visitors to forests and parks to be safe around campfires

Forest Fire Management Victoria (FFMVic) Chief Fire Officer Chris Hardman said with cooler temperatures settling in, it might feel like the fire risk has passed, but with parks and forests remaining dry, campfires can quickly escape and become devastating bushfires.

After a warmer and drier-than-average autumn and normal rainfall expected this winter, the fire risk is higher than usual – particularly in parts of western, southwestern and southeastern Victoria.

“Even at this time of year, just one unattended or poorly managed campfire can cause serious damage to the environment and put lives and property at risk,” Mr Hardman said.

“This season, we’ve responded to more than 370 incidents involving campfires. This included the Boroka Lookout Fire, where an illegal campfire turned into a bushfire in difficult terrain, on the edge of the cliff diverting resources responding to bushfires in the Grampians National Park.

“With a little extra care around your campfire this long weekend, we can keep forests and parks healthy and safe for everyone to enjoy.

“Never leave a campfire unattended and use water to fully extinguish it – if it’s cool to touch it’s safe to leave.

Chief Conservation Regulator Kate Gavens said: “Campfires are a cause of bushfires that are 100% preventable and our authorised officers will be visiting campsites throughout Victoria’s parks and forests to make sure everyone is following the rules so we can all have a safe and enjoyable long weekend.”

Parks Victoria Executive Director of Operations Kylie Trott said: “We want people to get out and enjoy Victoria’s great outdoors, but unsafe campfires can have devastating consequences. It only takes one camper ignoring the rules to endanger the community and our environment.”

CFA Acting Chief Officer Garry Cook AFSM said while conditions over the weekend will also be an opportune time for residents to burn-off, extreme care should be taken to ensure enough water and resources are on hand to extinguish burns properly.

“Escaped burn-offs, particularly in the current dry conditions, continue to cause significant concern and great risk to our communities across the state,” he said.

“It is really important landowners have someone monitoring their fire activity at all times. Although cooler days are arriving, now is not the time to be complacent.

“This weekend, take a moment to check the wind forecast, ensure you’ve left ample room in your fire break and please register your burn-off online to help reduce unnecessary callouts to emergency services.”

TALKIN' ...FISHIN'.....LIGHTENING THE LOAD

We all know how tempting it is to carry that extra piece of handy gear or that new fly or lure that's bound for glory.

Unfortunately over a few years that habit ends up being a weight on your shoulders, 'literally'. There will come a time when you'll have to re-assess the whole situation and lighten your load. There is absolutely no reason to carry around or with you every piece of equipment or tackle you own.

Hooks, not so many and sinkers will be the worst but necessary culling of it all.

Step 3. Essential tools only now, those that you can't do without, tears will flow! **Step 4.** The really important part now, have your trusted fishing mate go over your choices again, this time without the emotional restraints. This will really test your friendship out!

Remember to weigh your pack or vest before you start, then after, this will be your personal achievement and your ultimate goal and test of a job well done. Don't try and sneak stuff back in, wait till you've done a couple of trips first and see if you're really missing something or is it an insecurity with a touch of O.C.D. thrown in as well? Avoid the word "spare". I'm sure you'll thank yourself for taking out the extra weight, bulkiness and buoyancy threat should you fall in. Try to avoid things creeping back in by making this a yearly thing as it's easier to keep things in check that way.





Open Air Burning

Now that the CFA have declared that the Fire Danger Period has ended, many residents will be eager to resume bushfire fuel reduction works using open air burning after this date. CFA fire danger period declarations can be found <https://www.cfa.vic.gov.au/warnings-restrictions/fire-danger-period-restrictions>

On 1 July 2022, changes to local laws that may affect you came into effect to zones and days when burning off is permitted in Cardinia Shire.

The open air burning provisions are fully detailed in the Cardinia Shire Local Law 20 Open Air Fires which can be downloaded from Council's website: www.cardinia.vic.gov.au

Cardinia Shire is divided into 3 open air fire zones: Urban and Township Zone, Bushland and Peri Urban Zone, and Rural Zone. To check which zone your property is in go to: www.cardinia.vic.gov.au/burningoff

Please note: Open air burning is NOT permitted at any time during the month of July each year.

All burns, with or without a permit from Council must be registered to Triple Zero Victoria on 1800 668 511 or www.firepermits.vic.gov.au

Days when fires are permitted. No burning off in July.	Permit required	Sunday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday	Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday

Maximum size of fire (the size of the amount of material).	Permit required	3 metres in any dimension	3 metres in any dimension

When do you need a permit?

If your property is in the Urban and Township Zone or you can't meet any of the relevant conditions in a Bushland and Peri-Urban Zone or Rural Zone you will need a Council-issued permit to burn off. You can apply for a permit at no charge. Go to: www.cardinia.vic.gov.au/burningoff or by calling 1300 787 624.

Properties in all zones The following conditions must be met at all times:

- No burning on a CFA-declared Total Fire Ban Day or during the fire danger period.
- You must ensure all fires are attended at all times and be able to extinguish the fire at any time.
- No burning on severe weather warning days as issued by the Bureau of Meteorology (BOM).

Fire pits, barbecues, pizza ovens and chimineas

Properly constructed fireplaces, designed primarily for food and personal comfort, are permitted to be used where they do not cause an unreasonable nuisance and basic safety requirements are met. More information: www.cardinia.vic.gov.au






