COMMUNITY GATHERS TO SAY THANKS TO FRONTLINE WORKERS

CFA alongside other emergency services agencies gathered on Sunday 26th April at Gumbuya World for a 'Community Heroes Day' to say a big thank you to frontline workers and their families.

More than 5,000 emergency service personnel, families and community members came together on the Sunday to join in on the celebration.

The 'Community Heroes Day' was organised by the Emergency Services Foundation and Gumbuya World to acknowledge the efforts of all frontline workers and to thank the families who stand behind them.

Members from Bunyip and the Southeast Head Quarters Fire Brigades attended the event on behalf of CFA, with a tanker, Mobile Education Unit and children's activities.

Bunyip Fire Brigade Captain Jason Boler who has been with the brigade for 24 years said it was a privilege to have the brigade involved in the event. "Events like this are a great reminder that the work of emergency services doesn't go unnoticed," Jason said. "As volunteers, we couldn't do what we do without the support of our families behind us, so it's fantastic to have that support recognised."

Bunyip Fire Brigade Community Safety Coordinator and D09 District Support Officer Kylie Shanks said the day provided a valuable opportunity to connect with the community and other emergency services organisations. "The day couldn't have gone any better and it was a great location to host the event," Kylie said. "We had so many people come and show their support; ask us questions and participate in the children's activities we had set up". "Having the tanker on display and activities helped create an engaging space for families to enjoy throughout the day."

Kylie also highlighted the strong sense of gratitude and appreciation shown for emergency services workers and their families throughout the day.

"It was a really humbling reality to know that the community want to come together to recognise the work we do, It's nice to be thanked, but at the end of the day we choose to volunteer our time because we love what we do."



TALKIN' ...FISHIN' MAKING IT WORK

Well here comes winter again, so what are we going to do with our time? The brave ones will still fish even on the coldest days, the rest of us will pull our tackle boxes apart and assess the damage and restock. Here's where you can make a saving by tying your own rigs and packaging them individually in zip bags to prevent tangles, buy or mould your own sinkers and touch up the paint on your lures.

An alternative is to go online where you can buy blank and clear bib lures that you can completely paint in your own designed creations. Same goes for tying your own flies or pouring soft plastics into moulds. Wet and horrible days are a good time to check your rod guides for cracks or loose bindings to repair or replace. Lubricate your reels and free up bail arm rollers and clean the drag washers.

Always keep your imagination and eyes open for everyday items you can use for components to make your lures and tackle from. Spotlight is a good place to start or the \$2 shops craft section, you may crack it for the next "Hot" lure range. Finish is important so use a 2pack epoxy drying on a slow rotating motor, or resins that dry using a UV light source, Loom products or talk to your wife about her nail technician. Saltwater lures don't need to be as delicate, but bright colours are an asset.

I found a web site (link below) where you can order personally engraved lures in a crafted wooden box, a perfect gift for the coming Father's Day or Xmas and birthdays. Very special and very reasonably priced, but I would be afraid of using them on the river and snagging it.
