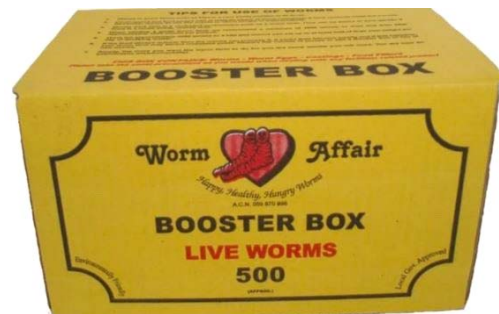
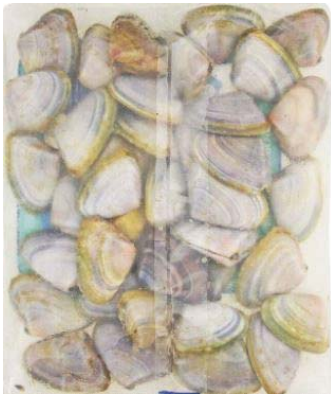
With the price of everything going up it's a battle to keep fishing an affordable sport, we need to look for variants and substitutes, or as near as possible for the task.

Bait is one of those to consider, with some research I was surprised to find table quality seafood that was cheaper to buy than what I would pay in the local tackle shops.

An example of these are:

Seafood markets, like Springvale Central are another great source for a huge variety of fish, big and small. A **'Warning'** though, avoid using food quality prawns from supermarkets for 'bait' as you could introduce (WSSV) White Spot Syndrome Virus, to our commercial prawn farms. Although not harmful to humans it is highly contagious to farmed prawns and devastating to the industry. Hillview Bunyip Aged Care Suzanne Beattie Wing

We have received many questions and enquiries from our community regarding the building works currently taking place at Hillview.

I am excited to share with you that we currently have a new wing to our facility under construction. The new wing, which has now officially been named, the **Suzanne Beattie Wing**, in honour of our long-service Board Chair, will contain sixteen new beds, a lounge area, library and private room for visiting family members. It also includes the addition of a new, much larger, laundry and staff room.

This means, that by the end of this year we will have a seventy-two bed aged care facility in the heart of Bunyip, that the whole community can be proud of.

The current extension is a \$5m project, of which half has been funded through a Federal Government grant.

Hillview is a 100% community owned, not for profit, standalone aged care facility and will continue this 33-year tradition when the new beds are opened later in the year. We currently employ 145 staff, with this number expected to increase to almost 180 when we are at capacity. Co-located on site are 25 Independent Living units as well as the Bunyip Men's and Women's Sheds.

In the coming weeks we will be asking the community to partner with us as we look towards the cost of fitting out the new wing. As a registered charity, all donations are 100% tax deductible and with tax time looming, it is a great way to help your local Aged Care facility pay for new furniture and equipment required to meet the standard of a modern aged care home. If you'd like the opportunity to see the new wing up close, will also be inviting community members to come and tour of the new extension.

We remain incredibly grateful for the support and generosity of our local community.

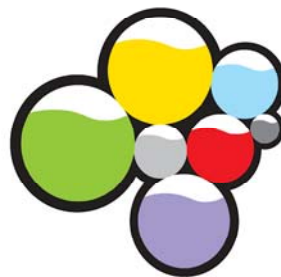

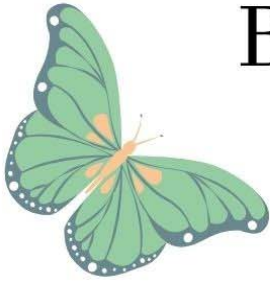

Laying the groundwork for future progress on our unsealed roads

Cardinia Shire Council has endorsed the Local Street Sealing Initiative (LSSI), establishing a consistent framework to guide how unsealed residential roads may be considered for future upgrades.

The Local Street Sealing Initiative (LSSI) outlines Council's long-term, strategic and sustainable approach to improving unsealed residential roads across the shire in a fair, transparent, and affordable way.

Previously, requests to seal roads were considered on a case-by-case basis. The LSSI changes this by setting out how unsealed residential roads may be assessed, considered, and progressively proposed for engagement as part of a Special Charge Scheme over time.

Cardinia Shire Mayor Councillor Brett Owen said this new initiative aligns with Council's commitment to improving unsealed roads, which is a key priority in the Council Plan.

"We know unsealed roads can be frustrating for residents, whether it's dust, rough surfaces, drainage issues, or access during bad weather. Our communities want to see real progress. This initiative gives us a clear, consistent, and transparent way to start addressing those challenges over time."

"Our Local Street Sealing Initiative provides a responsible and sustainable way to improve local streets, ensuring money is spent wisely and communities are involved in decisions. The LSSI enables more roads to be considered for sealing over time through a Special Charge Scheme for the benefit of residents and the wider municipality," Mayor Owen said.

The initiative sets out clear and transparent assessment criteria to help guide decision-making in a fair and consistent way. These include:

- affordability and estimated costs for property owners

- ongoing maintenance demands and asset management costs

- safety and emergency access

- resident enquiries and demonstrated community interest

Community engagement is an essential element of the LSSI framework. Council is proposing to engage with property owners to progress future road sealing projects through Special Charge Schemes. A Special Charge Scheme (SCS) is a legislated way for Council and benefiting property owners to share the cost of local road upgrades.

A staged consultation process has been mapped out as part of the LSSI, in line with the Local Government Act and Council's Special Charge Scheme policy, to empower property owners and Council to progress together.

Property owners will be informed and engaged at key stages, through information sessions and surveys. Property owner feedback will be a key factor in determining whether a road is recommended to proceed through the statutory SCS process or not.

Eligible streets will be progressively proposed for consideration and engagement as part of a potential Special Charge Scheme subject to assessments, funding availability, and further Council direction.

More than 170 unsealed residential streets are currently eligible for consideration under the LSSI. Inclusion in the initiative does not guarantee an upgrade, however it means a street may be considered for future planning and community consultation.

Under the LSSI, residents also have the option to submit a formal petition to Council, demonstrating majority property owner support for their road to be considered for a potential Special Charge Scheme.

With Council currently managing over 800km of unsealed roads across Cardinia Shire, the LSSI has been developed to help respond to the growing demands, challenges, and pressures of maintaining and trying to upgrade the unsealed road network.

"We know that essential improvements are needed to ensure that we can keep moving, and the Local Street Sealing Initiative sets out what Council can realistically begin to do."

"However, the substantial cost to upgrade our large, unsealed road network means that sealing all unsealed roads alone or all at once is not financially viable for Council or ratepayers. We need further support and investment from all levels of government to see significant progress being made on our unsealed roads," Mayor Owen said.

Council continues to advocate for funding for unsealed road upgrades ahead of the upcoming State election. To date, no additional funding has been secured.

"The Local Street Sealing Initiative won't solve every issue overnight, but it provides a clear, responsible path forward that balances fairness, affordability and transparency, while helping us improve local roads for our residents over time," Mayor Owen said.

Council is currently in the process of updating its Special Charge Policy to provide further clarity about its process. More information is expected to be shared later this year.

The Importance of having a Will

In Victoria, making a will is one of the most important steps a person can take to ensure their affairs are managed properly after death. Despite this, many people delay or avoid preparing one, often leaving their loved ones to face unnecessary stress and uncertainty.

A will is a legal document that sets out how a person's assets—such as property, savings, and personal belongings—are to be distributed after they pass away. It also allows the will-maker to appoint an executor, the person responsible for carrying out their wishes and managing the deceased's estate. Without clear instructions, even relatively simple estates can become complicated and time-consuming to administrator.

Under Victorian law, the rules governing wills are primarily set out in the *Wills Act (1997)*. For a will to be valid, it must be in writing, signed by the person making the will, and witnessed by two independent adults. The person must also have testamentary capacity, meaning they understand the nature of the document and the effect it will have.

The importance of having a valid will becomes especially clear when someone dies without one. This is known as dying "intestate," and in these circumstances, the estate is distributed according to a fixed legal formula under the *Administration and Probate Act (1958)*. While this system aims to be fair, it may not reflect the deceased's personal wishes or family dynamics. For example, assets may be divided in ways that exclude close friends, stepchildren, or charities that the person may have wanted to benefit.

A well-prepared will can also help reduce the likelihood of disputes. Family disagreements over estates are not uncommon, particularly where expectations are unclear or relationships are complex. By clearly outlining intentions and seeking proper legal advice, individuals can minimise the risk of costly and emotionally draining legal challenges.

Another key benefit of making a will is the ability to plan for dependents. Parents can nominate guardians for minor children, ensuring they are cared for by trusted individuals. Similarly, provisions can be made for vulnerable beneficiaries, including those with disabilities, through carefully structured gifts or trusts.

Importantly, a will is not a "set and forget" document. Life events such as marriage, divorce, the birth of children, or significant changes in financial circumstances should prompt a review. In Victoria, marriage can revoke an existing will unless it was made in contemplation of that marriage, making regular updates essential.

Ultimately, having a valid and up-to-date will provides certainty and peace of mind. It ensures that a person's final wishes are respected, eases the administrative burden on loved ones, and helps preserve family relationships during what is often a difficult time.

A Century of Dentistry in Bunyip: From Travelling Dentists to Modern Care

The history of dentistry in Bunyip reflects the growth of the township itself — from a small rural community with limited healthcare services to a modern regional centre with permanent, high-quality dental care.

One of the earliest recorded references to dentistry in Bunyip dates back to May 1913, when a travelling dentist known as Mr Thomas advertised that he would be consulting patients at the Gippsland Hotel. At that time, access to professional dental treatment in country towns was limited, and residents often depended on visiting practitioners who travelled between rural communities.

Historical accounts from the period suggest that, before the arrival of trained dental professionals, some local residents relied on improvised methods of tooth extraction. One well-known local story recalls that the railway station master occasionally removed teeth using ticket clippers — a reminder of how difficult access to medical and dental care could be in small Victorian towns during the early twentieth century.

For many decades, Bunyip did not have a permanent dental clinic. As the township developed through the mid-twentieth century and healthcare services gradually expanded, the need for regular local dentistry became increasingly important.

A major milestone in the history of dental care in Bunyip came in 2013, when Dr Hany Saman first visited the town with the vision of establishing a permanent modern dental practice for the local community.

After securing premises at 11 A'Beckett Road in September 2013, Dr Saman developed a new clinic designed to provide contemporary dental care in a welcoming and professional environment. Bunyip Dental Clinic officially opened in December 2013, with the first day of clinical practice commencing on 14 January 2014.

Significantly, the first day of practice took place almost exactly one hundred years after the recorded visit of Mr Thomas in 1913 — marking the beginning of a new era of permanent dentistry in Bunyip.

Under the leadership of Dr Hany Saman, Bunyip Dental Clinic became the town's first permanent modern dental clinic, providing general, family, preventive and cosmetic dentistry to local residents. Over the years, the practice grew alongside the community, helping improve access to dental care for families throughout Bunyip and the surrounding district.

As demand increased and technology advanced, the clinic entered a new chapter in August 2023, relocating to a purpose-designed facility at 7 Main Street, Bunyip. The move allowed the clinic to expand its services, modernise its equipment and continue delivering high-quality dental care in the centre of town.

Today, the story of dentistry in Bunyip stands as a remarkable journey — from travelling dentists and temporary hotel consultations to a modern, permanent dental practice serving the community every day.

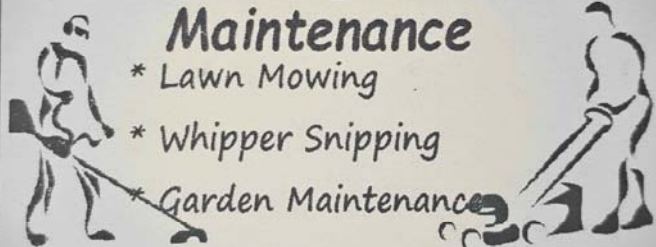

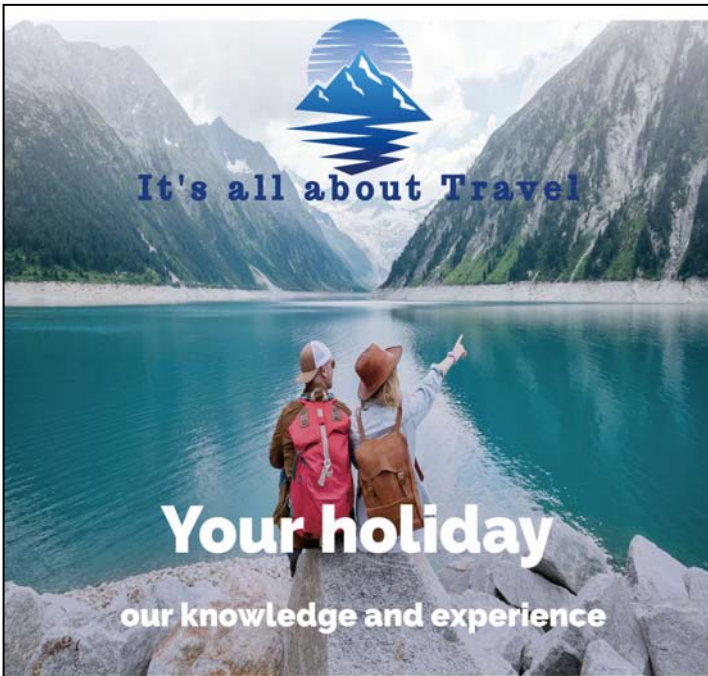
