BUNYIP-GARFIELD PROBUS CLUB

Our Gardening Group went to Wilson Park which is in Berwick to have a guided tour of the Gardens. The park was formerly a basalt quarry (bluestone). This rock was used to construct the Railway line to Gippsland, from Oakleigh to Bunyip with the crushed rock being used to support the sleepers on the track. The quarry stopped operating in 1976.

George and Fay Wilson donated 17 hectares of land for a Public Park known as Wilson Park in recognition of the early pioneers and in memory of James Wilson and his son George. The Casey Council brought another 17 hectares to add to the generous gift.

There is now 39 hectares of a well designed Park which has over 1000 different plants with so many different area's to explore. The Group were able to ask their guide lots of questions about some of the unusual plants and trees that are in the Park. Moy Yan Neighbourhood House



Are you a Summer or Winter person:


Winter is cosy winter bars drinking mulled wine and listening to jazz.

Cardinia Shire Council has today opened expressions of interest for Category 2 (Partnership Grants) as part of the Community Capital Works Grants Program 2024-25.

The Community Capital Works Grants Program assists community groups to improve community facilities that are used to strengthen local networks and support community wellbeing.

Grants of up to \$35,000 are available for capital works on Council owned, or Crown land in Cardinia Shire, with contributions from applicants.

Examples of past grant recipients include the Cora Lynn Football Club, which secured grant funding towards a LED electronic scoreboard upgrade, and the Cardinia Environment Coalition, which used the grant funding to construct a new pot wash facility at Deep Creek Nursery.

2024 Australia Day Award Nomination Guidelines



2024 Australia Day Awards

The Cardinia Shire Council Australia Day Awards acknowledge the contributions of local individuals and groups who have made outstanding contributions to the local community.

These awards recognise those who have shown a willingness to lend a helping hand, concern for the environment or participated in sport, arts, or cultural diversity. They share the aspirations of all Australians in respect of tolerance, democracy, equity, and equality of opportunity.

The successful awardees play an important role in the community during the year of appointment as role models and guest speakers.

How to compile your nomination

Nominations should meet the following requirements:

- submissions should be completed on the official nomination form in SmartyGrants, no hard copies will be accepted
- responses should explain the achievements, background, and reasons for the nomination
- attach copies of any newspaper or magazine articles about the nominee and their achievements
- list any other awards and include other relevant information
- submit the name of at least two other referees' details to support the nomination
- supply the full name and address of the nominator and state the relationship to the nominated person (self-nominations are not accepted)
- winners over 18 years of age must be willing to undergo a Victoria Police criminal records check (at Council's expense)
- winners (over 18 years) must undergo a Volunteer Working with Children Check

Please note: submitted information remains the property of Cardinia Shire Council.

Selection panel

A selection panel made up of community representatives, Council officer(s) and Councillors will assess the nominations.

The decision of the Cardinia Shire Council Australia Day Awards Panel is final, and no correspondence will be entered into.

Eligibility for individual nominations

Individuals are required to be:

- an Australian Citizen at the close of nominations
- a resident of Cardinia Shire

willing to accept the award (please ensure you get their permission to nominate

The individual nominated for Citizen of the Year, Senior Citizen of the Year and Young Citizen of the YearAward should demonstrate any or all of the following:

- takes the lead and shows demonstrated leadership
- provides a positive role model or mentor to peers and to others
- promotes the overall welfare and wellbeing of the community
- participates and has shown outstanding achievements in community activities, academic, sporting, personal, cultural, environment and civic responsibility.

In addition:

- Young Citizen of the Year nominees must be under 25 years of age on 26 January 2024
- Senior Citizen of the Year nominees must be at least 70 years of age on 26 January 2024
- individuals can only receive the same award once in a five-year period
- nominees cannot be a serving Councillor
- nominations will not be accepted for individuals for service in a position of paid employment
- awards will not be granted posthumously.

Eligibility for community event of the year nominations

The Community Event of the Year Award is presented to an organisation that has staged - onsite or virtually, the most outstanding community event between 1st November 2022 and 1st November 2023. This award recognises the contribution community groups make to the municipality.

The event must have:

- been hosted on site or virtually within Cardinia Shire between 1st November 2022 and 1stNovember 2023
- been open and accessible to all residents of Cardinia Shire
- showcased aspects of the local Cardinia community
- been managed appropriately.

The organisation responsible for running the event must be:

- based in Cardinia Shire and service people within the municipality
- a fully incorporated body with a public liability insurance policy to adequately cover their event, (proof of meeting these criteria will be required) or a Community Asset Committee
- not-for-profit and community focused.

The event nominated should reflect some or all of the following:

- purpose of the event and the outcomes achieved
- impact of the event on the community
- level of community participation, and ongoing sustainability
- operating within the budget allocated.

In addition:

- while some fundraising or profit may be a by-product of the event, it should not be the main focus
- consider whether the event offered something new and imaginative
- events can only receive the same award once in a five-year period.

Are you fire season ready?

Cardinia Shire is one of the most beautiful regions in Australia, but it is also one of the most bushfire prone. Preparing our homes and properties well in advance of the bushfire season is the most effective tool we have to keep ourselves, our families and the community safe.

Grass - keep it short!

Grass fires can start and spread quickly and be very dangerous. Reducing the risk of grass fire is the responsibility of everyone in our shire.

In the lead up to fire season, all property owners and occupiers should prepare their properties for bushfire, even if their property is not immediately next to bushland.

At a minimum you should:

- Maintain all grass and weeds on your block at less than 10 centimetres high
- Clear your property of fallen branches and dead vegetation
- Clean up fine fuels such as leaves, twigs and long grass and remove any rubbish.
- Larger rural and agricultural properties need to create a firebreak at least 10 metres wide along external fences by slashing grass and weeds to less than 10 centimetres
- Create separation between vegetation and buildings and fences by mowing and pruning vegetation.

Fire Hazard Inspection Program

Cardinia Shire Council undertakes an annual Fire Hazard Inspection Program which commences in the lead up to the fire season and comprises approximately 4,000 privately owned properties across the Shire. This program follows a risk-based approach which acknowledges that fire risk reduction is a shared responsibility for all residents in Cardinia Shire. The Fire Hazard Inspection Program is primarily focussed throughout the Fire Danger Period, however Fire Prevention Notices may be issues by an authorised officer year-round.

When a property has been identified as posing a fire hazard, a Fire Prevention Notice may be issued by a Fire Prevention Officer. The Country Fire Authority Act 1958 and Fire Rescue Victoria Act 1958 authorises Municipal Fire Prevention Officers to issue Fire Prevention Notices on owners or occupiers of private properties to complete fire management works.

If you receive a Fire Prevention Notice this means that a Fire Prevention Officer has inspected your property and determined it poses a fire hazard. If you do not comply with the notice, **you may be fined up to \$1,923**, and/or you may need to cover the cost of contractor hire to remove fire hazards, plus administration costs. Legal action may still proceed. Each property is considered individually for its level of risk, but there are key things Fire Prevention Officers look for when inspecting a property:

- Long, dry grass
- Fallen and dead vegetation
- Weeds contributing to a high fuel load
- Vegetation close to neighbouring assets.


