Bunyip Police Station

The first police station in Bunyip was a temporary one, which opened on the 25th February, 1893 and closed on the 17th June of the same year. A move to have a police constable stationed at Bunyip was made in May 1902, and new premises was erected in late 1903 with Mr Kraft, was the owner of the building. In February 1904 the Longwarry police station closed and a station opened at Bunyip.

Mounted Constable J.S Ryan who had been at Longwarry transferred to Bunyip, About 1912, Joseph Berry built a brick house for Mr Kraft on the

corner of George Street and A'Beckett road, and by at least 1930, this had become the police residence, with the station office and lock up at the back of the property. Four rooms in the house at that time were lined with hessian and paper, the office lined and the wooden lock up was in good repair. Horses were the means of transport for the police officers stationed at Bunyip until August 1929. In 1959, a new police station and residence was built in Pearson street, and from March, 1972, Bunyip took control of the Garfield Police sub-district.

SOCIAL TO MR J. RYAN.

Seventy or eighty ladies and gentlemen assembled in the local Mechanics' hall on Tuesday last to hid good-bye to Constable Ryan, who has been removed to the Metropolitan district. Mr Tolly opened the evening with a song, followed by a recitation by Master L. Gibb. Capt. a'Beckett, who was in the chair, called upon Mr Kraft to say a few words. Mr Kraft said that they had gathered there that evening to do honor to Constable Ryan, who was leaving their midst. He had known Mr Ryan for the last twelve years, during which time he had been stationed at Bunyip. He (Mr Ryan) had always taken a great interest in all social matters and had always been a hard worker in anything he had taken in hand. He had worked hard for the Cricket Club, the Debating Society, the Mechanics' Institute, the School Picnic and many other undertakings, the success of which was largely due to the energy and large interest taken in them by their departing guest. As a token of the esteem in which he was held by all classes, on behalf of the residents of Bunyip and the surrounding district, he had much pleasure in presenting the purse with its contents and gold pendant, and wished him every success in the



future in whatever part of the State he may be sent to. Mr Head also spoke and said that they were all sorry to lose Mr Ryan and that it would be hard to find another who would do as much as he had done for the town and district, and at the same time be always ready to do his duty. Capt. a Beckett, Messrs Nelson and Rodger also testified as to Mr Ryan's sterling good qualities and regretted his removal. Ryan, in reply, said that he thanked them all for the kindness and especially for the substantial token they had given him of their goodness. He was sorry he was going away, but he was going through no fault of his own. He had to go where duty called him, but wherever he went he would never forget the happy time he had spent in Buuyip and the many friends he had there. many friends he man indulged when Dancing was 3.m., company broke up after sp a very enjoyable time.

The day was extremely windy, and many trees came down in our area. Gum trees are renowned for falling, in all weather conditions.

The tree was cleaned up and was noted as being rotten on the inside. The next day another tree fell, and many branches have fallen since.

I believe that the gum trees have no place in this park, or anything else that could be hazardous. This park would be better utilised if there were some improvements made.

Some suggestions have been made:

- · Remove all gum trees
- Fence the park
- Install Toilets
- Upgrade play equipment

This park is utilised by children, mums, dads, grandparents and visitors to the area.

The rotunda is often used for family or community gatherings. But I do know that if it were fenced a lot more community members would go there.



What creates bushfire risk?

Terrain (topography)

A fire will burn faster uphill. This is because the flames can easily reach more unburnt fuel in front of the fire. Radiant heat pre-heats the fuel in front of the fire, making the fuel even more flammable.



For every 10° slope, the fire will double its speed. For example, if a fire is travelling at 5 km per hour along flat ground and it hits a 10° slope it will double in speed to 10 km per hour up the hill.

By increasing in speed the fire also increases in intensity, becoming even hotter.

The opposite applies to a fire travelling downhill. The flames reach less fuel, and less radiant heat pre-heats the fuel in front of the fire. For every 10° of downhill slope, the fire will halve its speed.

Fires tend to move more slowly as the slope decreases.

Vegetation (fuel)

- Grass can burn early and quickly on hot, dry, windy days.
- Branches, twigs and leaves dropped from shrubs and trees become fine fuels, which burn easily. These can give off far more heat when they burn
- Fibrous and dry tree bark can carry fire to treetops. The fire can then break away and spread further

Dry branches, twigs and leaves and other fine fuels found on the ground can also burn easily.

Weather conditions

Bushfires are unpredictable and vary greatly according to weather conditions. They often start on hot, dry, windy days.

Temperature

A string of hot days dries out vegetation, making it easier to burn. This can be made even worse by underlying dry conditions caused by lack of rain.

The drier the vegetation the easier it will burn. A fire spreads as a result of burning embers, radiant heat and direct flame contact.

Wind

Wind influences the:

- **speed** at which a fire spreads
- **direction** in which a fire travels and the size of the fire front
- **intensity of a fire** wind provides more oxygen
- likelihood of spotting

Wind change

A change in wind direction is one of the most dangerous influences on fire behaviour. Many people who die in bushfires get caught during or after a wind change.

In Victoria, hot, dry winds typically come from the north and northwest and are often followed by a southwest wind change. In this situation the side of the fire can quickly become a much larger fire

TALKIN' ...FISHIN' STILL LAUGHING

Many years ago, my mates and I were regular visiting Anglers to Waratah Bay in the Wilson Prom area, leaving us with many surf fishing experiences to remember and particularly Whiting and Mullet fishing in Shallow Inlet.

The method of fishing this inlet was to wade out when the tide is low, so you were close to the channels, then gradually move closer back in to the shoreline moving with the tide as it returned. Gear included a light rod and reel, a tall surf rod holder or tree stake, a keeper net bag to hang from it to hold your catch and a bait bucket strapped to your body. A decent pair of waders is essential as you'll be standing a long time in the temperate water. Sandworm and pipi was the chosen bait for the day's sauté, five of us were ready and anticipating a long day, so prepared coffee and snags in bread (Bunnings style) to sustain us through the fishing session. Things started out slow but the bites increased as the inlet filled, all synchronising with the volume of water around us. We were constantly repositioning ourselves shifting our pegged-out keeper bag of fish, carefully watching where we waded so as not to trap ourselves in the deeper zones.

We were well into the day now and within 30 metres of the shore, some of us were reluctant to give up the fishing, but time was running out and the light was fading. The last movements of us were viewed by other onlookers as we shuffled through the depths and soft sand and back into camp carrying our haul of fish. One of us was noticeably slower than the rest though, I'll call him Ron (cause that's his name) he was always frugal with his money, deciding before the trip to buy a Kmart pair of sock feet waders, a cheaper vinyl alternative as he didn't fish that often, he believed these would do the trick for this once-of excursion for him.

What he didn't count on was the poor workmanship in their manufacture, particularly in the seams. When he reached the water level aligned with his crutch he noticed half his body was 'Michelin man' like, with his legs totally filled with as much water as they could hold and his waders split through the crutch all the way from front to back. We had heard him complaining for hours about the coldness of the water, but remarked on just how soft his lifestyle must be, and to 'suck it up Princess'.

Watching him try to walk out was hysterical, half man, half elephant, when we stopped laughing (for a moment) our help came in the form of a fillet knife to cut him free from his waders and usher him in to the campfire on the beach where he could dry off his jeans and try to stop him shivering from the late evening winds bringing him now closer to hyperthermia, never seen anyone that cold and wet before! The rest of us needed a few hours for our ribs to heal from laughing so hard, 45 years has passed now since that trip and it still raises a laugh in me and the others when its mentioned, strangely though, not Ron.





Have you made your Will?

Having a Will is one of the most important things you can do for yourself and your family. It legally

protects your spouse, children, and assets, and it also indicates exactly how you would like your estate

handled after you have passed on.

A Will is a legally binding document that lets you determine how you would like your estate to be

handled and how assets within an estate are to be distributed upon your death. It might also include

your wishes as to who you want to care for your young children after you die and your burial wishes.

Everyone should have a Will. If you do not have one, the assets within your estate may not go to the

people you want them to, and there is no guarantee your intended desires will be carried out. Having a

Will also minimizes any family fights about your estate that may arise. In essence, a Will allows you to

decide how your estate will be distributed and importantly, to whom.

A Will provides opportunities to make critical decisions about who should take care of your young

children should that need arise. Without a Will, the Court will take it upon itself to choose among family

members or a state-appointed guardian. Having a Will means that you can appoint the person you want

to raise your children, or better, make sure it is not someone you do not want to raise your children.

To be eligible to make a Will, you need to be at least 18 years of age and be able to understand what

you are doing. This is known as having testamentary capacity.

Have a think about these questions before you make a Will:

Do you need help making your Will?

What assets do you own?

Who will be your executor/s?

Who you want to leave your assets to?

If you have young children, who will be their guardian?
