Memorable meeting with Jobe Watson

This being the Finals month in football prompted me to recall meeting Essendon champion Jobe Watson 38 years ago at Waverley Park.

At the time when I was reporting on the Maffra Football Club for the Gippsland Times newspaper in Sale, I was lucky enough to be an invited guest of former three-time Essendon premiership champion ruckman and then Essendon Board member, Don McKenzie, to an Essendon v's Hawthorn match at Waverley Park.

My six-year-old son Mathew was also an invited guest. The invitation included admission to the ground, lunch with the Essendon champion and entrance to the Essendon change rooms before and after the game to meet the players. Tickets were available for a limited number of supporters to get into the change rooms after the game where there was always a large media throng and Essendon personnel to jostle with to gain an audience with your favourite Essendon champion – after the game the change rooms were crawling with people.


To be able to get into the change rooms prior to a game was a definite "no no". However, being a guest of Don McKenzie that day, the red tape was cut, and Mathew and I were granted exclusive permission to go into the Essendon change rooms before the game. We were led through many corridors and down into the underground 'Bombers' change rooms. The place was eerily empty when we arrived, but gradually stars such as Paul Salmon, Tim Watson, Garry O'Donnel, Alan Ezard, Mark Harvey, Darren Bewick, Derrick Kicket and Simon Madden pushed their way through the swing doors of the change rooms to be met by Mathew with his autograph book asking for their signatures. Tim Watson walked in with his six year old son, Jobe. Mathew asked Tim for his autograph, and after Tim had signed it, Jobe looked up at his father, "Dad, I want to sign the book too." But Tim said that it was only for footballer's autographs.

I said to Tim that it would be fine for Jobe to give Mathew his autograph. Usually when footballers sign an autograph, they put their jumper number under their signature. As Jobe was not a footballer, he wrote the number '6' under his name, which represented his age. Many years later, young Jobe grew into a very fine and talented champion footballer. He was drafted by Essendon under the father—son rule in the 2002 AFL Draft and went on to become one of the greatest midfielders of the modern era.

He was the captain and champion at Essendon for many years and this meeting with him and his father, Tim brought back many happy memories of that day in those Essendon Change Rooms at Waverley Park.

While I won't say 'the good old days' as not all were good or easy, but things were a lot simpler, choices were limited to a few but reliable products from reputable dealers. I would like to include in those the SEC, Gas and Fuel Corp, PMG, and Telecom, let's leave out Vic Roads from that list. Stores that come to mind are the strip shops, the green grocer, butcher, bakery, and the ever needed Milk bar. Included in that the Service Stations where you could only buy petrol, oil and car related products, and service is what you got! Not from behind glass screens but in their driveway. Selling us brands like Hardy, Mitchell, Penn and ABU. These were our imported bands long before China's brands hit our markets.

Your outlay for a quality rod or reel was 25% to 30% of your weekly wage. Now days you could easily spend 100% or more on the top of the range equipment. Your selection could be something that was for that single weekend trip or the monthly family trips with a bit of fishing thrown in. Or the most affordable piece of technology available that only comes out for special occasions and is hidden away from the teens, with a warning curse placed on it for unauthorized users.

Service! Where has it gone? The need to service your customer should prioritize the making of a sale, it seems like your disturbing the staff from re-stocking shelves by asking for help. That's if you can find anyone! They seem to duck for cover when they see you coming, or is this a game of customer hide and seek that Bunnings and Spotlight invented? Many of us are left to fend for ourselves in the larger stores, no wonder online shopping has become so successful. Thank god for Google and Utube to show us what, where and how. This all just so we can go out and catch our own feed of fish that seems to only get more expensive. When you add up the price of your gear, licences, regos, fuel and bait, it's obvious that we're doing it for the passion of our sport, not the savings.

Look at the price of Fish & Chips these days, once a tasty affordable family meal alternative, WOW! Not these days. Spuds are like potato gold nuggets. While I'm straying from the subject a bit, it's all relevant to the fact that you get what you pay for but that doesn't always include customer service. You just need to pay attention and look around for what you need and don't reward poor service by shopping there again, complain if you feel strongly enough about your poor treatment. Knowledge and fair treatment by your local tackle store is a valuable experience and one that you can build a repour with over years of good service. Learning the latest techniques and gear available as they come on to the market. Most stores to hand on that information and if your loyal to them they'll return the favour. We really need more family owned tackle shops rather than the larger superstores, so support your local and enjoy the experience.

There has been lots of changes in the industry, noting that while print remains important, the news-room now runs with "digital- first " mindset publishing stories online as soon as they do happen. After a short informative talk we had a guided tour of the newsroom where they run through how the editorial and production process works from story development to final print

We were able to see the journalists and advertising staff at work and ask them any questions as we walked through the newsroom before going back into the boardroom for morning tea.

We thank the Star News Group for welcoming us and opening their doors to educate us on the roll that they play in the Community. We then went to the Pakenham Hotel for lunch.



Garfield North Community Centre starts to take shape

Construction is progressing on the much-needed Garfield North Community centre, a multifunctional space for local residents and organisations to hold community gatherings and events.

Since commencing works in May, More Building Group has been on site completing earthworks and preparing the land for construction. The slab pouring was completed in early June, roofing and framing works are complete and external cladding, window and door installations are currently underway.

Modules have arrived on site to support the new community centre's modular build, including a social room, kitchen, meeting room, storage, amenities, and a spectator cover/veranda.

Cardinia Shire Council Mayor, Cr Jack Kowarzik says the new building is set to become a central gathering point for the community.

"Located within Cannibal Creek Reserve, the new facility will be a hub perfect for community and social events, supporting various user groups in the area". "We're grateful for the community's patience and support throughout the construction process and look forward to seeing this project come to life" he says.

The project is supported by a \$1.3 million Victorian Government Growing Suburbs Fund grant, advocated for by user groups and the Cannibal Creek Reserve Committee, as well as a \$1 million investment from Cardinia Shire Council.

Over the coming months, contractors will be finalising the window installation, the solar PV system, and completing the mechanical, electrical and plumbing services rough in. Works are anticipated for completion late September/early October, pending weather conditions.

The Gippsland Line Upgrade is now complete

The Gippsland Line Upgrade is now complete, and passengers will soon benefit from more than 80 extra weekly services – with trains set to run approximately every 40 minutes between Melbourne and Traralgon, 7 days a week.

Trains returned to the Traralgon and Bairnsdale lines last week after a 55-day winter construction blitz to complete and commission a new train control system between Drouin and Traralgon.

The new train control system will allow Traralgon and Bairnsdale line trains to be more reliable and run more frequent services – it also enables the new platforms at Morwell and Traralgon stations to operate.

Crews worked more than 80,000 hours during the final construction blitz to install new rail signalling equipment and safety-test the new system, before V/Line completed driver training.

Completed upgrades to Morwell Station include a new second platform, an enclosed waiting room and improvements to accessibility, while Traralgon's second platform has been rebuilt to allow for more frequent and reliable services.

Passengers have already been enjoying better journeys from the Gippsland Line Upgrade, which enabled second platforms at Bunyip and Longwarry stations last year and modern VLocity trains to travel to Bairnsdale for the first time in 2018.

New services for Gippsland passengers

From Sunday 14 September, 55 new weekday services and 32 new weekend services will be added to the line as part of a new timetable.

Of the 32 weekend services, 14 will be on Saturdays and 18 on Sundays. These new services were made possible by the completion of the Gippsland Line Upgrade.

Sunday Sale services will be extended to start and end in Bairnsdale under the new timetable, giving more services and better travel options for Bairnsdale and Stratford locals and visitors to the region.



The Future is Stored

Bunyip North Energy Storage Project begins

As Australia accelerates towards a cleaner energy future, battery energy storage systems (BESS) are proving essential to the success of the renewables transition. RES' proposed Bunyip North Energy Storage Project, located just north of the Princes Highway, approximately 3km from Bunyip, is designed to address this need for reliable energy storage as more solar and wind power is integrated into the grid.

Proposed on a site currently used for cropping and grazing, the Project will support the stability and resilience of the local energy supply, ensuring that energy is available when it's needed most. The Project's footprint, up to 22 hectares in size, includes battery storage containers, operations and maintenance facilities and a switching station to support connection to the transmission network that run through the site. With a storage capacity of up to 400MW / 2400MWh (400MW for 6 hours), the BESS could supply electricity to over 250,000 households at times of peak demand.

RES has kicked off comprehensive technical and environmental studies in preparation for a Planning Permit application scheduled in early 2026. Construction is expected to break ground from mid-2027, with the Bunyip North BESS anticipated to be fully operational and delivering reliable energy to the grid by 2029.

Active community engagement is at the heart of this project. RES has already initiated conversations with the Bunurong Land Council as Traditional Owners, and neighbours have received direct communications with key project information and contact details. RES is reaching out to community members and groups to introduce the project, listen to local perspectives, and collaborate in shaping a positive renewable energy legacy for Bunyip North.

If realised, the Bunyip North Energy Storage Project will generate tangible benefits for the Bunyip District, including local jobs, economic opportunities, and dedicated benefit-sharing programs for the community and near neighbours. 
